

# The Wapack Trail Through Windblown

Welcome to the new route of the Wapack Trail through the Windblown Cross Country Ski Area. The Friends of the Wapack wish to thank the Jenks family for providing the relocation of the Wapack Trail through their property. Please respect their wishes by not parking on their property and by staying on the marked Wapack Trail route. The Wapack Trail is blazed through Windblown with wooden yellow triangles. There are many intersecting ski trails, so please look for the yellow triangles at each intersection to stay on the Wapack Trail. The ski trails are **not** open for hiking. The trail route is along the western border of the ski area.

## Directions for those hiking south on the Wapack through Windblown from Rtes. 123/124:

From the top of the Windblown driveway the Wapack follows the "Stagecoach Road" XC trail and then the "Back Forty" trail. Just after the intersection with the "Pine Tree Trail" the Wapack bears right off of the "Back Forty" trail and follows an old skidder trail. It then intersects a snowshoe trail. Bear right on this trail and follow it to just below the summit of Barrett Mtn. at which point the Wapack continues straight following a stonewall a short distance till it meets the original location of the Wapack Trail.

## Directions for those hiking the Wapack Trail through Windblown from Barrett Mtn. and points South:

From the point where the Wapack Trail enters Windblown the Wapack takes a sharp left and follows a stonewall a short distance to a point just below the summit of Barrett Mtn. where it joins a snowshoe trail. The trail follows the snowshoe trail and then bears left onto an old skidder trail (marked with signs). It follows this trail until it turns onto the "Back Forty" ski trail and then the "Stagecoach Road" trail which it follows to the Windblown driveway on Rtes. 123/124.

**Notice: The Wapack Trail will be closed through Windblown during mud season. Winter hikers are required to purchase a ski area pass available at the Lodge when the ski area is open. There is no parking available at Windblown. Use the existing parking along Rtes. 123/124.**

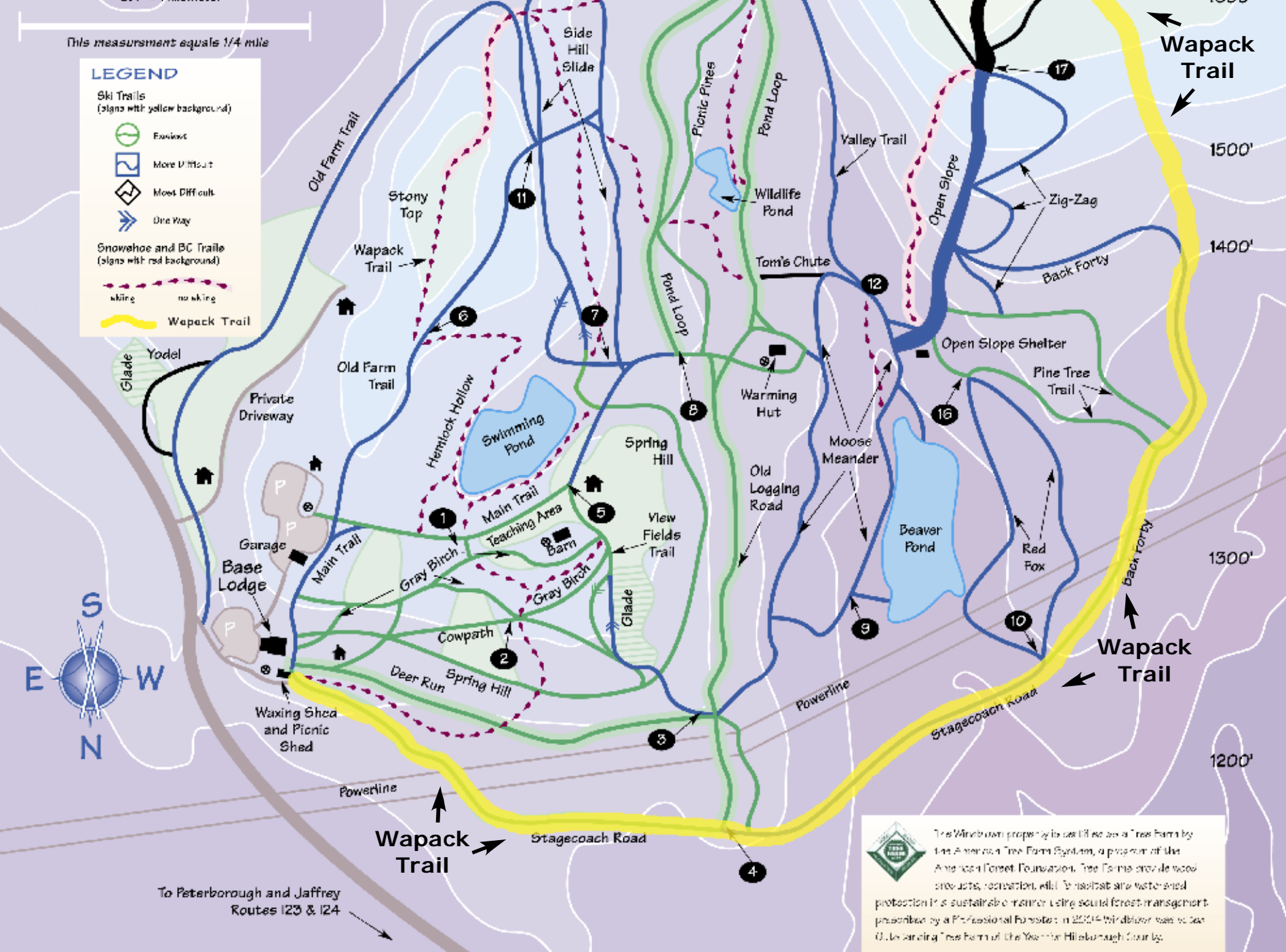
