## From the President—Banner Year 2007

It looks like 2007 will be a banner year for the Wapack Trail. Three very important projects are underway to improve or confirm the permanence of major portions of the Trail.

**TEMPLE HIGHLANDS:** House Bill 183-FN, introduced in the New Hampshire General Court by Representative Anne-Marie Irwin, of Peterborough, was successfully passed by the House with a strong majority. This has authorized the New Hampshire Department of Resources and Economic Development (DRED) to acquire the property that was the Temple Mountain Ski Area,

and protect it as a state reservation. DRED's division of Parks and Recreation manages Miller State Park, which abuts this property. The Governor's Capital Budget includes necessary funds, but the legislature must still review the financing, and the NH Senate must also pass a companion bill. It has been felt that the House was the major hurdle, and are very optimistic for finalization, with your continued support. The Friends must thank Representative Irwin, and the Monadnock Conservancy for their strong leadership.

**WAPACK NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE:** The 1,625-

acre refuge was donated to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service in 1972, and is the most northern three miles of the Wapack Trail. As mandated by federal law, the Service has commenced a CCP (Comprehensive Conservation Plan) for the area, which is formal report of the

area as it exists today, and the management plan for the next fifteen years. The Service has held two public hearings, during which it was evident that the Service wants and expects the Friends to continue to maintain the trail, and have recommended that a formal MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) be formalized between the Service and the Friends. The schedule for the completion of the CCP is by the end of 2007.

**WAPACK WILDERNESS:** As was reported in last falls edition of the VOICE, the Northeast Wilderness Trust (NWT) has secured an option to place a conservation easement on 1,400 acres owned by the Hampshire Country School in Rindge and New Ipswich, which contains almost two miles of the Trail. The NWT reported in February that former New Hampshire

Governor Walter Peterson and his wife Dorothy have agreed to serve as Honorary Chairpersons for the campaign, and that they had raised over \$540,000 in gifts, pledges and grants, which is 38% of the required \$1,400,000. Their goal is to complete the fundraising activities by the end of 2007, with pledges being received through 2009.

Normally, winter for the Friends has been a time of rest, relaxation, and looking forward to being on the Trail come spring and summer. I can assure you that the past few months have been anything but peaceful and quiet for your Board of Directors. But we will enjoy the fruits of our labors when the weather improves and hiking the Trail in not an exercise of survival.

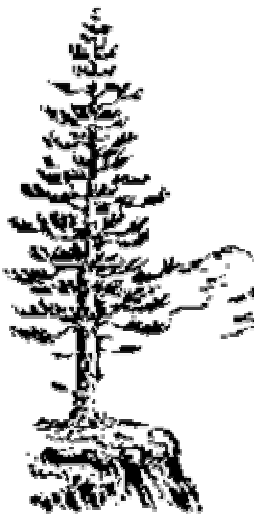

## Friends of the Wapack Trail Workdays

For 2007 we have a number of interesting workdays scheduled. The workdays play a key part in making the Wapack Trail what it is. They are designed to supplement the work of the trail captains and to accomplish tasks beyond that what is expected of the trail captains. For those of you who may not have the time to volunteer to be a trail captain by adopting a trail section, they provide an opportunity to give something back to the trail. I urge you to show up for at least one of the workdays and see how much fun it is. You'll probably get dirty and sweaty, but I can assure you that you'll feel a sense of accomplishment at the end of the day.

All workdays are on Saturday and start at 8:30 AM and typically wind down around 3:00 or 4:00 in the afternoon. Bring lunch, water, work clothes, and enthusiasm. We supply the tools and encouragement.

Saturday April 28 North Pack, Old Mountain Road trailhead, Greenfield, NH. We'll be doing general drainage work on the northernmost section of the Wapack. This will include revisiting a wet spot near the start of the trail and two rapidly eroding sections near the summit of Pack Mo-

nadnock. Plan on lunch at the summit.

Saturday September 22: Route 123/124 north to Nashua Road. We'll meet at the parking area located off of Routes 123/124 near Wind-blown. The primary objective of this workday is to re-route around a beaver dam and remove some downed trees located north of Wildcat. We'll also be doing general maintenance on this, the flattest section of the trail.

Saturday October 27: Miller State Park/Temple Mountain. Meet at the Miller State Park lot on Route 101. We will be doing general maintenance on the Marion Davis Trail and possibly some work on Temple Mountain depending on time.

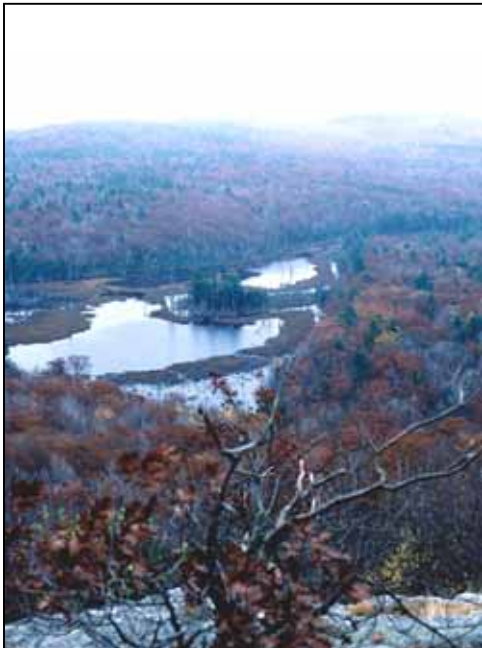

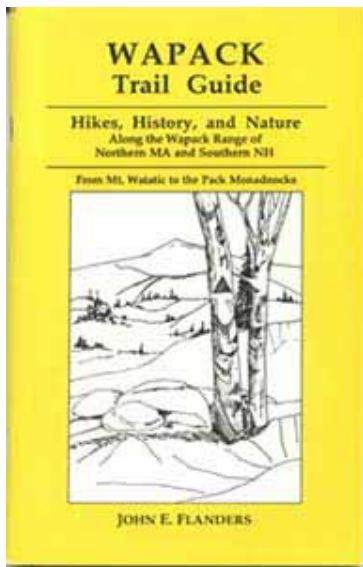

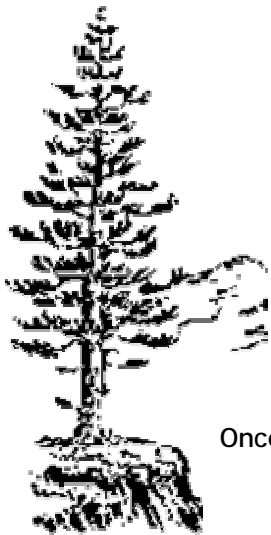
