From the President

Recently I have been musing over the events of the past fourteen years that I have been associated with the Friends, and reviewing the many big and little happenings that have culminated in the progress that Wilderness protects more than a

the Friends have made towards their stated mission of maintaining and improving the trail and protecting it for future generations to enjoy.

Of the major protection events, four stand out: the Temple Mountain State Reservation, the Wapack Wilderness

Conservation Easement, Mount Watatic Conservation holdings and the permanent protection of the Cabot Skyline under a Municipal Trails Act easement. In each of these, the Friends played a significant role, but in each case, others were critical in the success. The Temple Mountain State Reservation and the Cabot

Skyline easement were keystones in protection of the northern third of the trail, as well as side trails. The Mount Watatic efforts protect the southern terminus, and the Wapack

mile in the southern section. There are still tasks ahead to insure a permanent and complete trail right-ofway, and we should dedicate our efforts towards this goal.

The ice storm of December, 2008 did significant damage to many parts of the trail, and yet, within a



Trail Work Days 2010

Trail maintenance goes back to its normal schedule this year after last years bit of weather inconvenience (the Great Ice Storm and aftermath!).

Saturday May 1, 2010 – Mt. Watatic

The first workday will be at Mt Watatic. We'll meet at the Route 119 parking lot at 8:30 AM. We'll be doing general trail work on this heavily used portion of the trail. We plan on installing some water bars on the section between Mt. Watatic and Nutting ledges as well as improving blazing at the summit. There will also be some minor chainsaw

Mountain. We'll meet at the Windblown Ski area in New Ipswich at 8:30. This location is a long hike in so we'll be concentrating on this particular project and less on general trail maintenance.

Saturday October 23, 2010 – Temple Mountain

For the final workday we will be cutting a new trail to connect the parking lot at the new Temple Mountain State Reservation to the Wapack Trail. This is tentative and may change depending on trail conditions and feedback from the State of New Hampshire. Meet at the Temple Mt. State Reservation parking lot, Rt. 101 Peterborough, at 8:30AM.

Mud Season Notice

We often get email questions this time of year about trail conditions. Many wonder if the trail is muddy or dry. At this writing on March 22, not only is most of the trail muddy, we still have some snow and ice, particularly on the North facing slopes. The weather during February and March was extremely wet with lots of rain and snow. Binney Pond is higher than it has been in memory. The soil is soft and saturated. Hiking on a muddy trail loosens the soil and promotes erosion. Please consider staying off the trail for the next few weeks until the trail dries out. Thank you!


