

tion Commission to talk about their impending purchase of 180 acres along the Wapack Ridge, including the summit of New Ipswich Mountain, at 1,881 feet, the highest point in the town. This acquisition includes a significant portion of the Wapack Trail, and would eventually be linked to the 1,400 acre Wapack Wilderness, a forever wild area managed by the Northeast Wilderness Trust.

At our Annual Meeting a couple of years ago, Al Jenks, the owner and operator of the Windblown Ski Area told the membership that he planned to retire within a couple of years, and that he had signed a conditional sales agreement with the North East Nordic Council, who indicated that they wished to upgrade the area and make it a recreational and training facility for cross country skiing and biathlon, contingent upon them being able to raise sufficient funds to purchase the property and make appropriate upgrades. This conditional sales agreement expired, and many members, aware of Al's desire to retire, were very concerned about the future of Windblown. It was announced a few weeks ago, that Al had decided that he would manage the area through the 2011-12 season, and then turn over the operation to his son Andy. The Jenks family have been very good friends to the Wapack, and we sincerely hope to continue this relationship with the coming generations of Windblown operators.

With spring-like weather on the horizon, our Section Captains will be out in force to clean up winter's debris, and to survey for hanging branches, muddy spots and other hazards. As you enjoy the Wapack Trail this spring, assist these hard working friends, and pick/clean up where ever you can. Let Mike and/or Rick know of potential problems, so that they can plan and fix. Enjoy the solitude and the splendor of the Wapack!

<u>Mud Season Notice to Hikers</u> - We often get email questions this time of year about trail conditions. Many wonder if the trail is muddy or dry. At this writing on March 27 the trail and woods are still covered with snow and ice in most places due to colder than normal March temperatures, particularly on the North facing slopes. When the spring thaw finally begins the soil will become soft and saturated. Hiking on a muddy trail loosens the soil and promotes erosion. Please consider staying off the trail for the next few weeks until the trail dries out. Thank you!


