This is an exciting year for the Wapack Trail! The Northeast Wilderness Trust Binney Hill Project looks certain to close this year. Our Annual Meeting on October 22 will celebrate this effort and present details about the project, the property, and plans. So please come to the meeting to celebrate with us. Our speaker will be Daryl Burtnett, the Executive Director of Northeast Wilderness

the trail, the Friends of the Wapack have pledged \$25,000 from our funds to this effort for trail protection. The Northeast Wilderness Trust and all involved are committed to securing permanent access to the Wapack Trail across this land. Please see the box at right for details and how to donate. Thank you!

In other news, we've been working with state and federal agencies to improve Wapack Trail signage on public lands. Watch for new trail signs around Mt. Watatic, Temple Mt. State Reservation, and the Wapack National Wildlife refuge. Our revamped website is up and running! (See article on back page.) On August 5 we partnered with the Peterborough Town Library on a group hike up North Pack. We arranged for USFWS naturalist and staff to join us for a very interesting and fun hike. And welcome new Section Captains Pat Little and her son James. They have adopted the trail section on the south end of Pratt Mt. to Binney Pond. Thank you all for your support! Northeast Wilderness Trust Binney Hill project update

We're almost there! Of over \$900,000 needed by Northeast Wilderness Trust to purchase and protect the 485 acre Binney Hill Property in New Ipswich, including a mile of the Wapack Trail, there is about \$50,000. to go. With your support, the project could close this year!

Conserving this land will protect connectivity for Wapack Trail hikers and wildlife between conservation lands around Mount Watatic to Binney Pond Natural area and the Wapack Wilderness conservation easement on Pratt Mt. These large Wapack Trail protection opportunities are rare. So please consider contributing to this important effort.

We concentrated on drainage work and general maintenance on the section of the trail from Binney Hill Road north to Stony Top. We dug a drainage swale to divert water off the trail on the section just before Binney Pond and installed two wooden water bars on the steep climb up Pratt Mountain.



May 7 also happened to be the day of the annual Wapack Trail End to End race. So we enjoyed cheering on the runners while gratefully accepting their thanks.

Notices

Winter use of the Wapack Trail through Windblown Cross-Country Ski Area

- 1. With snow on the ground everyone using the Wapack Trail through Windblown property needs to pay for a trail ticket.
- 2. Everyone must use skis or snowshoes, no hiking.
- 3. In winter with a trail ticket you can use the Windblown parking lot during the day, not overnight.
- 4. Dogs are not permitted.
- 5. Check the Windblown website to see if they are open or stop into the ski shop between 9 and 5. If not open no trail fee.
- 6. Snowshoers need to stay out of the ski tracks.
- 7. People coming from south to north and not leaving a car in the lot can pay on their way out. Thank you!


